



BCS Fee Schedule

School Year 2026/2027



As a non-profit educational institution in the heart of Berlin, EBS Europäische Bildungsstiftung gGmbH prepares children and adolescents from infancy onwards for nationally and internationally recognised school qualifications. Berlin Cosmopolitan School (BCS) includes a full-day Kindergarten & Preschool, an "Offene Ganztagschule" Primary School, and a connected full-day Secondary School (Gymnasium). It is our goal for our students to become enlightened and responsible world citizens who live their lives with confidence. We focus on academic performance, multilingualism, and developing social and intercultural skills.

To achieve this goal, we work with dedicated and professional teachers, well-equipped rooms, modern teaching and learning materials and offer a diverse afternoon programme, and healthy food. Our children and students learn in a multilingual environment and enjoy the benefits of the international community to develop a well-educated, bilingual self. BCS follows the standards of the International Baccalaureate Organisation, as well as the educational guidelines of the state of Berlin.

The school fees are parents' contribution to the costs of all BCS activities. The non-profit status of our school ensures that every Euro is invested in high-quality teaching and the continuous improvement of a modern learning environment for children and students.

1. Monthly fees

Parents pay income based school fees (see table) based on the grade level of the student, and the family income (the sum of the positive earnings of all parents/legal guardians). To be eligible for fees, parents must annually submit a copy of their income tax assessment form as well as the "self-assessment for fee calculation" form by June 1 before the new school year. If parents choose not to claim school fees or do not submit their tax form or the above form before the deadline, fees are calculated as listed under "without proof of income", see table below. BCS reserves the right to review the income statements and the form for factual accuracy.

Grade 1 and 3 will get a voucher from 1.30 pm – 4.00 pm without a formal review. Nonetheless an application must be submitted.

1.2.1 Parental contribution for all-day support/LS (day care)

Grades 1-6

BCS offers supervision in the open all-day primary school from 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. For this reason, in addition to the school contract, a separate after-school care contract is concluded for afternoon care from 1:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. To this end, parents must submit an application for supplementary support and care (eFöB) at general education schools to their competent district office. A copy of the after-school voucher must be submitted to the school by 15 June or, at the latest, within two months after conclusion of the contract; otherwise, the substitute fee pursuant to Section 1.2.2 becomes due. The amount of the parental contribution is income-dependent and is determined by the competent authorities in accordance with the Day Care Costs Participation Act (TKBG). If only an after-school voucher valid until 4 p.m. is available, BCS may charge a surcharge of EUR 75.

1.2.2. Parental contribution for afternoon care/LS (Hort) without a voucher

Grades 1-6

If you do not provide the school with a voucher, an additional fee of EUR 480 per month is charged for the afternoon programme.

1.2.3 Afternoon Programme from Grade 7

The afternoon programme is part of the BCS secondary school curriculum and is therefore mandatory.

1.3 Catering

monthly payment/12 months

For nutritional reasons all students must participate in school lunches school lunch (two options, salad and dessert, allergies can be catered for). In addition, students receive an afternoon snack and water and tea and, as of Grade 6, breakfast. The fee listed below for grades 1-6 is charged for this service. Lunch for grades 1-6 is financed by the Berlin Senate, provided that the Hortgutschein (afternoon care voucher) is submitted. All meals are prepared in-house by professional catering staff and designed for specific age groups.

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2. Administrative fees

2.1 Application fee

one-time payment

A one-time application fee of EUR 50 is charged for each student who receives an invitation to an entrance test. This fee is waived for families with verified positive annual income below EUR 30,000.

2.2 Registration fee

one-time payment

The registration fee is EUR 1,200 per student and is due upon conclusion of the contract. For families with annual gross family income of less than EUR 40,000, this fee is reduced to the amount of the monthly tuition fee, and it is waived entirely where annual family income is up to EUR 30,000. This fee is not charged when a student transfers from BCS primary school to the BCS secondary school.

2.3 Prepayment

one-time payment

This fee is payable upon signing the contract and will be counted as a prepayment for the last three months at BCS. Families with a proven gross family income of less than EUR 40,000 are exempted from this payment, if they request exemption before signing the contract. For this purpose, please send an informal request to mail@cosmopolitanschool.de before signing the contract. The advance payment is waived for families with verified positive annual income below EUR 30,000.

2.4 Learning and working materials

annual payment/1st August

BCS provides students with all textbooks and teaching materials.

For this purpose, parents pay a lump sum once per year. Should costs for Grades 7 to 12 be higher, the prices for learning and working materials may be adjusted / recharged during the school year. This fee also includes the use of digital media, licences, etc.

For families with annual gross income of up to EUR 30,000 (sum of all positive gross income), we charge EUR 100.00 per child.



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2.5 Additional Fees

Other costs, such as materials for afternoon activities, external tests or examinations, learning support, class trips and other additional services, will be invoiced separately. We support holders of a BuT pass in applying for possible benefits. Additional examination fees apply for the IB Diploma examinations; the amount is determined by the IB Organization and invoiced by us.

2.6 Sibling Discounts

For families with more than one child at the school, we grant a sibling discount on tuition as follows:

2nd child 15% discount

3rd child 25% discount

4th child and each additional child 50% discount

Upon application, and where the economic circumstances of the parents / legal guardians justify it, we grant a sibling discount as follows:

2nd child 25% discount

3rd child 50% discount

4th child and each additional child 75% discount

2.7 Fee Regulation to Ensure Compliance with the Prohibition of Social Segregation and for Socially Disadvantaged Families

For families with verified annual gross income of all legal guardians of up to EUR 30,000.00, tuition amounts to EUR 100.00 for the oldest child, EUR 75.00 for the second child, EUR 50.00 for the third child and EUR 25.00 for each additional child.

These families are fully exempt from payment of the application fee, admission fee and advance payment (Section 2.3).

School clothing is reduced in price or provided free of charge upon application for students from families with verified annual gross income of up to EUR 30,000.

No charge is made for the afternoon snack and breakfast in primary school.

For learning and working materials, an amount of EUR 100.00 per school year per child is charged (see Section 2.4).

Our Finance Department supports families with a BuT pass in applying for these benefits, for example for class trips, teaching materials and lunch in the secondary school.

BCS maintains a quota for children from socially disadvantaged families for a partial or full waiver of tuition.

Families with verified positive annual income of less than EUR 40,000 may, upon application and following detailed review, agree reduced fees with us.

3. Fee Regulation for Self-Employed Persons and in Special Asset Situations

3.1 Tuition Assessment for Self-Employed Parents

Tuition is generally determined in accordance with the school's currently applicable fee table, which provides for an income-based scale.

If one or both parents are self-employed, tuition will be set on the basis of the regular fee table, but at a minimum of EUR 350 per month.

The reason for this rule is that the actual income of self-employed persons can only be compared to the income of employees to a limited extent due to tax planning options, depreciation and fluctuating earnings.

In justified exceptional cases (e.g. demonstrably low income due to illness, business start-up or financial hardship), the management may, upon application and for a limited period, approve classification in a lower bracket. The application must be submitted in writing and supported by suitable documentation (e.g. income tax assessments, business evaluations).

3.2 Asset Situation

In justified cases, significant assets may also be taken into account in addition to current income if they materially increase the family's financial capacity.

This applies in particular where there are cash assets, real estate assets or company shareholdings whose value exceeds EUR 500,000.

In such cases, the school may increase the tuition by up to three levels of the fee table or set a minimum fee.

The school management will decide at its due discretion while safeguarding data protection.

Parents or legal guardians whose current income falls below the income levels provided for in the fee table are obliged to disclose the existence of substantial assets insofar as these are relevant to the assessment of their financial capacity.

Substantial assets include in particular:

- balances in bank and savings accounts,
- securities or portfolio assets,
- real estate assets (income-generating properties),
- company shareholdings or proceeds from the sale of a business,
- other assets with substantial market value.

Evidence of existing assets shall be provided by means of a written self-declaration by the parents stating the type and estimated value of the assets in an appropriate form. A precise listing or disclosure of all accounts and records is not required. What matters is a credible and comprehensible presentation of the asset situation.

In justified cases, the school may request additional documents to verify plausibility, for example:

- confirmation from a tax adviser regarding asset status,
- relevant extracts or documents with non-required data redacted,
- notarial or official evidence of the sale or acquisition of real estate or company shares.

All information and documents will be treated confidentially and used exclusively for the determination of tuition. They are accessible only to those persons entrusted with fee assessment and will be securely destroyed or deleted after completion of the calculation. No disclosure to third parties will take place.

The consideration of substantial assets serves to ensure a fair assessment of the families' actual financial capacity.
